SENIOR AWARDS PROCESS POLICY

- EACH FACULTY (9-12) IS GIVEN A LIST OF ALL SENIOR BOYS AND GIRLS FOR THE AWARDS.
- EACH FACULTY (9-12) THEN CHOOSES FIVE CANDIDATES TO NOMINATE FOR EACH AWARD. THESE NOMINEES THEN GO TO THE SCHOLARSHIP COMMITTEE WHO COUNTS THE BALLOTS AND MAKES THE FINAL RECOMMENDATION OF THE FIVE CANDIDTES.
- THE FIVE NOMINEES THEN MUST FILL OUT AN APPLICATION FOR THESE AWARDS AND SUBMIT BEFORE THE DEADLINE TO THE SENIOR CLASS MODERATOR. <u>FAILURE TO SUBMIT THE NECESSARY</u> <u>DOCUMENTATION ON TIME MAY ELIMINATE A CANDIDATE FROM</u> <u>CONSIDERATION.</u>
- A COMMITTEE COMPOSED OF THE ACTIVITIES DIRECTOR, COUNSELOR, SENIOR SPONSOR, PRINCIPAL AND/OR ASSOCIATE PRINCIPAL EXAMINES THE APPLICATIONS. IF THERE IS A CONFLICT OF INTEREST, AN ALTERNATE MEMBER OF THE COMMITTEE IS CHOSEN BY THE ADMINISTRATION.
- EACH COMMITTEE MEMBER RATES THE CANDIDATES, USING SPECIFIED RUBRIC, IN THE AREAS OF: PARTICIPATION AND SERVICE IN SCHOOL, PARTICIPATION AND SERVICE IN THE COMMUNITY, LEADERSHIP AND ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE IN PROPORTION TO ABILITY BASED ON THE COMPLETED APPLICATION AND OTHER INFORMATION.
- THE RUBRIC SCORE (OUT OF POSSIBLE 25) AS WELL AS MANY OTHER VARIABLES ARE THEN DISCUSSED BY THE COMMITTEE. THIS DISCUSSION SHALL INCLUDE ANY CODE OF CONDUCT VIOLATIONS BY THE POTENTIAL CANDIDATE. THE COMMITTEE SHALL, IN ITS SOLE DISCRETION, DETERMINE WHAT EFFECT ANY CODE OF CONDUCT VIOLATION ON EACH CANDIDATE, HOWEVER A VIOLATION SHALL NOT BE AN AUTOMATIC DISQUALIFYING FACTOR.
